

## **ILLINOIS STATE UNIVERSITY SCHOOL OF ART** **SCHOLARSHIPS/AWARDS**

ISU School of Art scholarships are awarded primarily on the basis of artistic talent and potential. The School of Art offers several scholarships and awards ranging from \$200 to full tuition waivers. Only students who plan to be full-time art majors are eligible to apply.

### **SCHOOL OF ART TUITION WAIVERS**

- Eligibility:** Student enrolled as an art major at I.S.U. for the semester following the award.  
**Award:** Payment to help in defraying the cost of tuition.  
**Criteria:** Artistic ability and performance based on portfolio review.  
**Application:** Application form, portfolio and/or evidence of scholarly production received in the School of Art office.

### **FRIENDS OF THE ARTS TALENT GRANTS**

- Eligibility:** Enrolled student in an I.S.U. School of Art degree program.  
**Award:** Monetary award up to \$200 to be applied to any need the semester following the award.  
**Criteria:** Artistic ability and/or scholarly performance in studio practice, art history or art education studies.  
**Application:** Application form, portfolio and/or evidence of scholarly production received in the School of Art office.

### **THE ELIZABETH STEIN SCHOLARSHIP**

- Eligibility:** Student enrolled as an art major at I.S.U. for the semester following award.  
**Award:** Up to \$500 toward tuition and fees. Name added to the Elizabeth Stein Art Scholarship Plaque in the C.V.A. building.  
**Criteria:** Artistic ability and performance based on portfolio review; scholarship performance in other academic areas financial need.  
**Application:** Application form, portfolio and supporting evidence received in the School of Art office.

### **THE MARY R. WALKER SCHOLARSHIP**

- Eligibility:** Undergraduate art students with a major concentration in Fabric, Sculpture or Metals who are enrolled, or will be enrolled, at I.S.U. for the semester following award.  
**Award:** Monetary award up to \$400 to be used during the academic year for tuition and fees. Name on the Mary R. Walker Scholarship Plaque.  
**Criteria:** Artistic ability and performance based on portfolio review.  
**Application:** Application form, portfolio and supporting evidence received in the School of Art office.

### **THE STEPHANIE AMSTER DESIGN SCHOLARSHIP**

- Eligibility:** Undergraduate art students with a concentration in Photography, Visual Communications or Three Dimensional Design who are, or will be, enrolled at I.S.U. for the semester following award.  
**Award:** Monetary award to be used during the academic year for tuition and fees. Name on the Stephanie Amster Design Scholarship Plaque.  
**Criteria:** Artistic ability and performance based on portfolio review.  
**Application:** Application form, portfolio and supporting evidence received in the School of Art office.

### **THE EDWIN NIEMI METALS SCHOLARSHIP**

- Eligibility:** Undergraduate or graduate art student with a concentration in Metals (jewelry, metalsmithing or sculpture) who will be enrolled at I.S.U. for the semester following award.  
**Award:** Monetary award (\$200) to be used during the academic year to help defray tuition and fee payment.  
**Criteria:** Artistic ability and performance based on portfolio review.  
**Application:** Application form, portfolio and supporting evidence received in the School of Art office.

### **SCHOOL OF ART UNIVERSITY TELEFUND**

- Eligibility:** Enrolled student in an I.S.U. School of Art degree program.  
**Award:** Monetary award up to \$200 to be applied to any need the semester following the award.  
**Criteria:** Artistic ability and/or scholarly performance in studio practice, art history or art education studies.  
**Application:** Application form, portfolio and/or evidence of scholarly production received in the School of Art office.

### **THE NORMAL EDITIONS WORKSHOP SCHOLARSHIP**

- Eligibility:** Enrolled student in the School of Art with a discipline area of printmaking.  
**Award:** Monetary award of \$300 (\$150 each semester dependant upon recipient's continued eligibility).  
**Criteria:** Artistic ability and/or scholarly performance in printmaking..  
**Application:** Application form, portfolio and/or evidence of scholarly production received in the School of Art office.

### **ROBERT SMALL AWARD**

- Eligibility:** Papers submitted must be at least 10 text pages in length and written in previous calendar year on any art historical topic.  
**Award:** The winner will receive \$150 and have his/her name inscribed on a permanent plaque in the School of Art, art history slide library.  
**Criteria:** Originality, writing style, evidence of solid research skills.

### **THE MARY M. PACKWOOD SCHOLARSHIP**

- Eligibility:** Graduate or undergraduate Art Education majors with a minimum of 90 semester hours of work who are enrolled in the School of Art degree program for the semester following the award.  
**Award:** Monetary award up to \$300 for the academic year to be used toward tuition and fee payment. Name on the Mary M. Packwood Scholarship Plaque.  
**Criteria:** Outstanding performance in academic achievement, studio production, and/or field experiences. Demonstrated skill in written and oral communication.  
**Application:** Application form, transcript, three letters of recommendation (at least 2 of which are from I.S.U. School of Art faculty members), a portfolio of your work or your student's work; examples of written work.

### **THE MARY BRUCE SCHOLARSHIP FUND**

- Eligibility:** Enrolled student in the School of Art with a discipline area of Art Education or Studio Art.  
**Award:** Monetary award up to \$300 to be applied to any need the semester following the award.  
**Criteria:** Artistic ability and/or scholarly performance in studio practice or art education studies.  
**Application:** Application form, portfolio and/or evidence of scholarly production received in the School of Art office.

### **THE DONNA JO ADRIAN AWARD**

- Eligibility:** Determined by the Art Education Faculty
