Alumni Honoree Biographies



Dr. Andy Rummel is Professor of Tuba and Euphonium at Illinois State University in Normal, Illinois. A native of Delavan, Illinois, Andy received his Bachelor of Music Education and Master of Music Performance degrees from Illinois State University in Normal and his Doctor of Musical Arts degree from the University of Illinois in Champaign-Urbana. His private teachers include David Fedderly, Mark

Moore, David Zerkel, and Rex Martin. Andy is the former principal tubist with the Heartland Festival Orchestra and has performed with the Peoria Symphony Orchestra, the Illinois Symphony and the Virginia Symphony.

Prior to his arrival at Illinois State, Andy was the principal tubist with the United States Air Force Heritage of America Band and the Heritage Brass Quintet located at Langley AFB in Virginia. Andy has been a guest soloist with the Heartland Festival Orchestra, the Vermont Youth Philharmonia, the Prairie Wind Ensemble, the Rockford Wind Ensemble, the Brass Band of Central Illinois as well as many high school bands and orchestras throughout the Midwest. He has been a featured recitalist at many international and regional tuba-euphonium conferences that has served as an adjudicator for numerous international and regional tuba solo competitions.

Dr. Rummel's students have been very successful in performance competitions and professional auditions. Illinois State University students have been semifinalists in the International Tuba and Euphonium Conference (ITEC) Artist Solo Tuba Competition and the ITEC Chamber Ensemble Competition. Recently a studio member won third place in the Artist Solo Tuba division of the prestigious Leonard Falcone International Tuba and Euphonium Competition, and two other students were named semifinalists in the Artist Solo Tuba and Student Solo Tuba divisions. Additionally, studio members have won solo and ensemble competitions at several regional tuba and euphonium conferences and have been finalists at several prestigious military band auditions. Graduates of the tuba and euphonium studio are performing in professional military bands, teaching at universities, and are employed as music educators around the world. Dr. Sharon Huff is a distinguished music educator, conductor, and international leader in the brass community. She earned her Bachelor of Music Education summa cum laude from Illinois State University, where she was honored as a Bone Scholar, and later completed both her Master of Music and Doctor of Musical Arts degrees at the University of Illinois. Now retired from university teaching, Dr. Huff held faculty positions at Millikin University, Illinois State University, and St. Norbert College near Green Bay, Wisconsin. Her teaching portfolio spanned humanities, music literature, and music education, reflecting her broad expertise and commitment to interdisciplinary learning.

Dr. Huff has held numerous leadership roles in international music organizations. She served the International Women's Brass Conference (IWBC) as Executive Director, President, Treasurer, and two-time Conference Co-Host. She also contributed globally as Conferences Coordinator for the International Tuba Euphonium Association (ITEA), helping organize events across multiple continents. As a clinician, conductor, adjudicator, and soloist, Dr. Huff has performed and led ensembles throughout the Midwestern and Eastern United States, as well as in Australia, New Zealand, Fiji, Italy, Finland, Germany, and Austria. She has adjudicated prestigious competitions including the Falcone Solo Euphonium Competition, Gateway Brass Band Championship, and the ITEA and IWBC Solo and Composition Competitions.

Dr. Huff has been honored to perform with Monarch Brass and has appeared as a soloist and conductor with the Athena Brass Band. She has also guest conducted the Monarch Brass Ensemble at ITG and IWBC events, as well as the Michigan Monarch Brass Ensemble in Kalamazoo, Michigan.

Since 2007, Dr. Huff has served as Music Director of the Brass Band of Central Illinois, and she continues to share her musical gifts as Choir Director at the First Baptist Church of Bloomington.
