Glenn Williams retired in May of 2021 from Downers Grove South High School, having served as a music teacher and the Fine Arts Department Chair since 2005. In addition to teaching and holding arts administration leadership roles at Highland Park High School (IL) and in Grand Rapids, Michigan, Mr. Williams also was on the brass/jazz faculty of the Indiana University Summer Music Clinic, and was a member of the jazz faculty and co-coordinator of the Jazz Division at the Blue Lake Fine Arts

Camp in Twin Lake, Michigan, leading the International Jazz Ensemble on European Tours in 2014 and 2017. Mr. Williams holds degrees from Indiana University, Northwestern University and Concordia University. Mr. Williams has completed coursework towards a DMA in Wind Conducting at Michigan State University. From 2009-2019, Mr. Williams held a National Board Teaching Certification.

Mr. Williams is currently supervising student teachers for DePaul University Northern Illinois University and the University of Illinois/Champaign-Urbana. Mr. Williams traveled to Cuba in January of 2023 as a Teaching Artist with the Cuban American Youth Orchestra (CAYO) working with student and adult musicians in Havana and Matanzas. Covering a sabbatical leave, Mr. Williams conducted the Wind Symphony at Northern Illinois University during the spring semester of 2025.

As a professional performer, Mr. Williams has performed with numerous entertainment and jazz luminaries, including The Four Tops, Frank Sinatra, Jr., Michael Brecker, Kenny Wheeler, and the Blue Lake Faculty Jazz Sextet. Mr. Williams has also performed with numerous community ensembles including the North Shore Concert Band directed by John Paynter. In the summer of 1984 Mr. Williams was a member of the Walt Disney World All-American College Marching Band.

Mr. Williams has conducted numerous band and jazz honor ensembles, including the Illinois All-State Jazz Ensemble (2014) and the North Carolina All-State HS Jazz Ensemble (2022.) Mr. Williams led the process to commission *Tricycle* by Andrew Boysen to celebrate the consolidation of North Shore District 112. Mr. Williams helped initiate the <u>BRIDGE</u> program, an ILMEA professional development strand equipping first year music teachers in Illinois. Mr. Williams received the Mary Hoffman Award of Excellence from ILMEA in 2017. In 2025 Mr. Williams received the Paynter Lifetime Achievement Award sponsored by Quinlan and Fabish Music.

Mr. Williams expresses deep gratitude to all the teachers, students, colleagues and friends who continually inform his identity as a human, as an artist, and as an educator.

Dr. Reginald Lewis currently serves as the Director of Jazz Studies at Illinois Wesleyan University. Under his direction, he created a new academic course, *Exploring the History of Hip Hop*, further broadening the university's music curriculum to connect contemporary and historical African American musical expressions.

Dr. Lewis has graced major stages including the TD Bank Winnipeg Jazz Festival, Hyde Park Jazz Festival, Chicago Jazz Festival, and the CU Jazz Festival. His artistry also extends to recording and publishing; he released his debut jazz album, *Echoes of Cherry Street*, as well as a jazz methods transcription book, *Bootsie Barnes "Three Miles Out" Transcribed Solo Collection*. Dr. Lewis was also featured in the James Brown biopic "Get on Up".

Dr. Lewis is a published research author through GIA Publications, contributing to *Teaching Music Through Performance in Jazz, Volume 3*. His work in this series reflects his expertise in jazz pedagogy and his commitment to advancing the field of jazz education through scholarship.

Beyond the classroom and stage, Dr. Lewis plays an active role in national and regional jazz communities. He serves as President of the African American Jazz Caucus and Chairperson of the AAJC HBCU/PBI Spotlight for the Jazz Education Network, positions that allow him to advocate for equity, representation, and visibility in jazz education and performance.

Dr. Lewis's leadership and influence also extend to adjudication and clinician work. He has served as Adjudicator and Clinician for the Illinois State Jazz Festival, Purdue Jazz Festival, and Eastern Illinois University Jazz Festival, and as an ILMEA Adjudicator. He also hosts and directs the annual Illinois Wesleyan University Jazz Festival and has taught as a Jazz Instructor at the ISYM Jazz Camp. He also served as both a JJF Clinician and Jam Session Host at the Jazz Education Network (JEN) Conference.

A proud alumnus of Jackson State University, the University of Manitoba, and the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign, Dr. Lewis continues to inspire students, colleagues, and audiences through his teaching, scholarship, and performance, embodying the spirit of jazz.
