Frequently Asked Questions

Q: What coronavirus(COVID-19) safety measures are in place for the hybrid camp?

A: The following safety measures will be in place for the hybrid camp:

- COVID-19 Acknowledgment of Risk Form required to be signed by all participants
- Daily symptom tracker card to be completed by parents and sent with students daily
- Properly fitting masks required for all students and instructors at all times
- Staggered drop off/pick up times to limit congestion
- · Parents will be asked not to leave their vehicles during drop off/pick up
- Most small group classes will take place outside weather permitting or transition to Zoom in the event of poor weather
- Strict room capacity and air turnover limits following CDC guidelines
- All students will be required to bring their own music stand and play off their own parts

Q: What are the exact hours for the morning session if I choose the hybrid option?

A: Because we will need to stagger the drop off and pick-ups and rotate through a limited number of large classrooms and outdoor spaces, exact meeting times will be communicated no later than two weeks before camp begins. Students will be placed in groups with others at a similar level of experience.

Q: Will there be a concert at the end of the week?

A: Yes! There will be an informal concert on Zoom by each orchestra group for hybrid students only. Parents can watch remotely and the concerts will be recorded and available for one week after the performance.

Q: Do I need to be a String Project student to participate in either option?

A: No. All string students entering grades 4-8 with at least one year of playing experience are welcome!

Q: Are scholarships available?

A: Yes. A limited number of need-based scholarships are available for students who qualify. Please email Dr. Lewis at <u>kilewis@ilstu.edu</u> with any questions.

Q: Who will be teaching the classes?

A: Most classes are taught by String Project undergraduate and graduate students under the supervision of Illinois State University faculty. Some classes will be led by Illinois State faculty.
